PUBLIC MEETING GUIDELINES

Albany City Council meetings are conducted in person at City Hall Council Chambers. Members of the public may also participate virtually. However, the City cannot guarantee that the public's access to teleconferencing technology will be uninterrupted, and technical difficulties may occur from time to time. In the event of these difficulties, the City will comply with the Brown Act and its Disruption Policy, which may mean City Council meetings will continue despite technical difficulties for participants using the teleconferencing option.
